

# A New Project



I got an e-mail from a friend wondering if I wanted a project and when I found out what the project was said I sure would.

Pictured above, from left to right is a little Miss Bohemia, a no name foamy glider and a Carl Goldberg Gentile Lady.

The project is to power these planes with outrunner electric motors and update the electronics.

The glider already has a three phase motor and controller and the Miss Bohemia had a small brushed gear motor and controller and the Gentle Lady was powered by an OS25 four cycle engine.

The first thing I did was to see whether all



three planes could be changed and be powered with new motors, controllers and batteries. Mainly, could I be sure to get the right cooling air?

After looked them over

and decided all was possible I stripped the Gentle Lady of her engine and she didn't even blush. Removed the brushed gear motor, controller and old seven cell Ni-cad battery, which tested GONE, from Miss Bohemia.

The foamy uses a unique rudder control

horn and it's built into the vertical fin. When I tried moving the rudder with the servo arm it was very stiff so I took the arm off of the servo and 'exercised' the rudder linkage until it moved somewhat easier but I'm still going to use a standard size servo because I don't think the little micro servo that's in the plane is up to the job.

We don't want a real dog in any of these planes so I used Dr. Keith Shaw's formula. 100 watts per pound of plane for gentle flying. 150 watts per pound for 'normal' and 200 watts per pound for hotshots.



For Miss Bohemia that equates to a 250 park flyer motor, a Castle Creations nine amp controller, a two cell 2SpL25 Li-po and a 7X4 prop.

The Gentle Lady gets a power Pac meant for another glider and it has a 480 park motor. 30amp controller and will have a 3SPL25 1300 mah battery.

The foamy already has a brushless motor and controller and I'm going to use the same battery in it that powers the Gentle Lady.

All three planes will be controlled with a Spektrum® six channel radio, the DX6i Microlite. That radio comes with small servos and a Microlite receiver.

My friend asked what frequency the Spektrum® was on and I told him that all spread spectrums were on 2.4 gigahertz and he said that was amazing.

Actually, and I don't know, what the spread is on 2.4. Whether it goes from 2.0 to 2.6 gig or what but when a receiver is bound to it's transmitter, for all practical purposes, it's the only radio in the world on it's frequency.

Will the three planes fly? When they are ready to go and the wings put on they won't have any choice. Easy as she goes.


