A long time flying friend e-mailed me, or his don't have much to work with here.

When I found out what he had in mind was to 'electrify' three airplanes he had I said that cell 2,200 mah Li-Po and controller would would be fine.

A New Project

Actually, this is a continuation of what I started in the last issue of the Broken Prop.
I finished the Gentle Lady and the next project was the Miss Bohemia and Nan took this photo of the

finished Miss Bohemia.

I'll give you the stats to start off with and go from there:

Wing span is 41 inches, Fuselage length is about 30 inches from the back of the spinner to the back of the rudder, the motor is an E-Flight® Park 250, the Li-Po battery is a 3 cell Thunder Power® 480 mah rated at 25C and the prop is an APC slow flyer 7X3.8

I was originally going to use a Castle® 9 amp BEC controller but that would almost limit it's future use to a plane such as the Miss Bohemia so I went with a larger 15 amp unit.

Note the nose on the plane and how short it is. I removed a brushed motor with a gear box and figured the added weight of a bigger BEC would help offset that weight.

And talking about weight, I never weigh a plane because "What you see is what you get" but I do know that the Miss Bohemia is almost as light as a feather as the saying goes and she will be an early morning or later



afternoon flyer when the breeze is nill or almost so. Here you can see how short the nose is and I ended up putting 3/4 of an ounce of lead in the nose

and the battery and BEC as far forward as I could get them to bring the CG into range. It's at about 30% of the chord and with a Clark Y

flat bottom airfoil should work fine.

The mini servos for the elevator and the rudder have their arms sticking out of the sides of the 'cockpit' and the plastic tubing en-



closed control wires run all the way back to the control surfaces on the outside of the fuse for a nice simple hookup.

Note too the Deans Ultra® connector for the battery. I use those connectors because when I got a sloppy connection with a bullet type and expanded the flutes of the male half to tighten the connection there wasn't much contact area and that was a concern.

I give each half of the Deans a light coat of Vaseline® to make them easier to use and haven't had a problem in a couple years of use with the Deans Ultra's.

As the British say "I'll have a go at it." and



put the Miss Bohemia in the air when Gene and I and the weather comes together.

I will probably have the no name foamy soaring machine to-

gether and ready to go and do both planes at the same time and, hopefully, that will be before the next Broken Prop newsletter comes out.

Will it fly? Does Miss Bohemia have a choice? The CG is right and it has enough power and the wing is chomping at the bit to haul the fuse around and the elevator and rudder are going in the right direction so she has to fly!


