I really want to bring this up because since I have gone to all electric planes I find that getting a plane in the air is almost

as simple as getting a paper plane up.

I'm not talking about the preliminaries like checking the planes for safe flying, charging the batteries and loading the wagon.

The batteries get charged when I get home and the planes get checked then too and if something is wrong I fix it. Can't wait or I would forget it and have to fix it before I was ready to fly again.



I don't concern myself with getting fuel on the upholstery in the wagon by plugging the exhaust with a rag, Check that the fuel tank is plugged and not tripping and making sure the gallon jug of fuel is secure and won't tip over. I do keep a clean rag in the wagon to wipe off the dust, grass clippings or whatever.

If this looks like I'm championing electric flight to you then go to the head of the class because that's exactly right.

I don't miss having to lug the jug of fuel around and making sure the plane is cleaned of fuel residue like that sticky Castor Oil before it gets put in the wagon or van. Don't miss adjusting those pesky needle valves and getting close to that spinning prop. I especially don't miss that since my trip to the emergency ward to patch up what was left of a finger.

One thing I do miss is the sound that infernal combustion engines make because I can't hear my electric plane while a "gassy" is flying too. But I have gotten use to that and just fly until my plane tells me that it is running out of electrons.

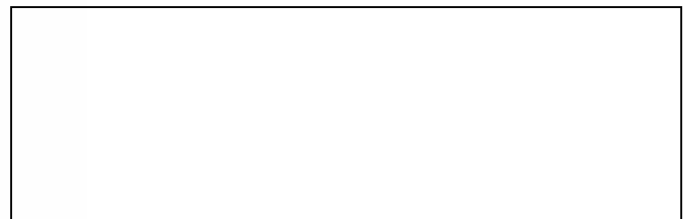
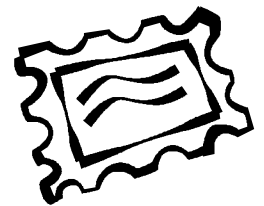
