The scanner was a Yaesu VR-500 miniature high-performance monitoring station. We are waiting on a price quote to purchase one for the club.

Gathering of Eagles

On **Saturday, July 12** at 9:00 am until 2:00 pm, the River District R/C Eagles are hosting their annual "**Gathering of Eagles**" flying event. R/C pilots from around the area put on a great show including Scale models, Giant scale models, Warbirds, Helicopters, Combat demonstrations, and a Candy drop for the kids.

There is also a raffle and food concession and some tailgate swapping. This is one of the bigger shows in the area, and is a great time. Come on out and bring a plane, or come out just to enjoy the event. There is a 1-dollar parking donation.

On Sunday **July 13**, the Eagles host "**Dollar Day**", and invite non-flyers to fly on the "buddy box", with an instructor, for a dollar donation. This event gives children and adults a chance to experience a "hands on" feel of R/C aviation. This event usually gives about 100 to 150 prospective R/C pilots their first chance on the "sticks".

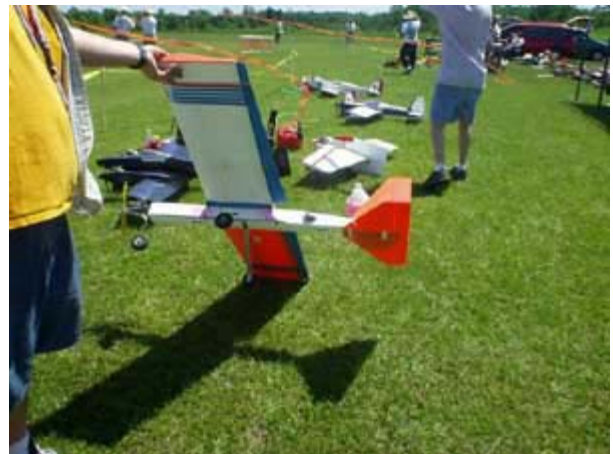
PROPBUSTERS FUN FLY 2003
